- Organized collection - easy to access
- Focuses on High Impact Instruction/Research
- Helps educators plan for RICH learning
- Provides guidelines
- Provides structure for new teachers
- Good resource for Administrators =- what to look for in classrooms/observations,etc

FOUNDATIONS of a GREAT Playbook

● CONTENT PLANNING

- High Impact planning, simple strategies that teachers can use to identify what is taught and assessed

● INSTRUCTION

- Instructional practices that teachers can use to engage students, increase student mastery of content and apply learning.

FOUNDATIONS of a GREAT Playbook

FORMATIVE ASSESSMENTS

- Strategies and Tools to monitor and provide ongoing feedback that can be used by teachers to improve instruction and students to improve learning

COMMUNITY BUILDING

- Strategies teachers can use to build community, a safe place for learning, creativity and joy in the classroom.
